## **Annual Program Highlights**

**Bowie EEA presented 3 of the state programs, opting to skip "Beekeeping" as we had presented a similar program county-wide a few years back.**

**In addition to the state programs, we take input from members for programs of interest. A couples of favorites:**

**\*A book review by member Mary Whatley is an annual tradition. Always entertaining, Mary's selections range from romance to mystery.**

**\*Member Sheila Schindler spoke of her ongoing business relationship with an Amish family of basket makers from Iowa. She shared what she has learned about the Amish way of life and traditions.**

**We were able to go on 2 field trips this year:**

**\*In Decatur, we toured the Wise County Heritage Museum located in the former Northwest Baptist College built in 1893. Each room features different exhibits such as fossils and artifacts, mercantile and The Lost Battalion.**

**\*In the spring, we toured Color Orchids in Nocona. Built in 2020, the company will triple in size soon with additional greenhouses. Color Orchids supplies more than 15 varieties of orchids to upscale supermarkets and florists throughout the Northwest.**

**Bowie EEA donated monthly to 2 continuing service projects:**

**\*God's Table, hosted by Freewill Baptist Church along with the support of other civic organizations, church groups and individuals, provides meals 6 nights a week serving 75-100 meals.**

**\*Bowie Mission is opened once a week to distribute boxed food to approximately 300 individuals. As a result of the generosity of these services, they are often left with limited food in stock following the holidays. Bowie EEA donated \$1227.00 to "Restock the Pantry"—our focus holiday service project for the year.**
